

- Good news for the fisherman, the changes to the Marine Park Zones have been cancelled by the new NSW Government and revert back to the conditions you have enjoyed since 2002.
- Central Area 1 will be having a meeting with council on 31st
 August and we have until 17th August to submit items to be placed on the agenda. Area 1 takes in Culburra, Greenwell Point, Currarong, Orient Point, Callala Bay, Callala Beach and Myola.
- We have finally solved the doggy doo bag problem. Trevor has found a product that comes in a stainless steel carrier that can be bolted and padlocked to the Sulu Bin stands. We have ordered three, one for Centre St, Callala Beach Rd and Myola. If this doesn't work, we may have to adopt the system that works very well in Kiama. Anyone found walking a dog without a plastic bag is fined instantly. Let's hope we don't have to go to that extreme.
- Callala Bay has asked for our support to Shelley Hancock and Joanne Gash to possibly have an obsolete ship scuttled in the Jervis Bay area. The creation of an artificial diving reef would enhance our tourist attraction. The deep water outside the heads may be a possibility.

- taking into consideration the Naval Exercises and our reg ular visits from the migrating whales.
- Callala Bay has also approached the Beach with a proposal to engage the services of an outside professional to design a Strategic Plan for the Bay/Beach/Myola area. This concept worked very well at Greenwell Point, as anyone who has walked along their beautiful foreshore will contest to. This would be a combined project, with public meetings held to identify and prioritize the best way forward. Change will come whether you want it to or not, nothing stands still and it's better to have it go in the direction you want.
- Council have agreed to tree pruning on the corners of King George Rd, Sir Henry Cres and Parkes Cres. Also in this budget will be the replacement of the Callala Beach Rd beach ramp and the viewing seat will be moved to a better position, where? at this stage we don't know, but we will find out.
- The Telstra pit on the corner of Watts Rd and Griffith St was reported dangerous and has since been fixed.
- The storm water pit on the corner of Lennox Rd has collapsed and has been reported.
- It was mentioned that the width of Myola Rd makes it necessary for bicycle riders to head off into the grass when there are two cars together and the current mowing schedule is insufficient to keep the area clear.
- A free sausage sizzle is to be held at Parkes Cres on Saturday 25th
 June 11am to celebrate our long awaited amenities block and a way of
 engaging with the community of the Beach and Myola.

Harry Parker was born on 29th September 1920 and passed away on 25th May 2011.

Harry and his wonderful wife, Beryl, were early residents to Callala Beach. There was no electricity, town water or sewerage but like everybody else they made "DO". Harry was always busy working to make improvements to Callala Beach.

He was an integral member of Progress and the Senior Citizens and an avid Historian. I have heard the stories of Progress Members turning up to meetings carrying their hurricane lamps. When the Community Hall was burnt down by vandals Council decided that residents would have to use Callala Bay Hall, Harry was one of the enthusiastic residents to change Council's mind and they agreed to rebuild on the old site, hence our much admired Hall.

I never heard Harry complain about Council's neglect, you just got on with things. Harry was a great Historian and when we held our "Back to Callala Day" Harry spoke eloquently of our history. Harry was a founding member of St.Mark's Anglican Church, after the Hall was destroyed he encouraged everyone to build a Church at its present site. He kept a history of St.Mark's and proudly showed everyone.

Harry's contribution to Callala Beach is immense and long lasting and we should be very grateful for his presence and dedication. We send our love and sympathy to Beryl and the Family.

STRATEGIC PLAN FOR CALLALA AND MYOLA



A similar plan was developed in Greenwell Point and this has helped them achieve a lot of improvements for their town. Just go and visit the foreshore area at Greenwell Point. Apparently if we can have a community plan adopted by Council then it empowers them to apply for grants etc to help fund projects.

The plan needs to be developed with the help of the whole community via community work shops that will be run by an independent consultant. We will keep you posted on the exciting project.

CALLALA BEACH VOLUNTEER RURAL FIRE BRIGADE

Over the past month there were two callouts. The first was to a car on fire on Forest Road. The car had hit a kangaroo and burst into flames upon stopping and was totally destroyed. The second call out was to assist Callala Bay brigade at a very large pile burn on a vacant block of land.



doubtful that the hazard reductions that were planned to take place in the Callala Beach/Bay, Culburra and Currarong areas will now take place before spring.

Training over the last month has consisted of brigade training in structural fires

A lot of emphasis is currently being placed on Community Education by the Rural Fire Service and some members of the brigade are training in this very important process. Over the coming months it is proposed that the Shoalhaven District RFS will hold forums to advise residents various methods of being prepared for fires.

Permits are not required until September for all fires in the open. Residents burning backyard waste must notify your neighbours and Fire Control (4424 4424 during office hours) 24 hours before burning. It is advisable to have water available, the size of pile to be no bigger than 1.5 metres across and a responsible person must remain with the fire at all times until it is extinguished. If water is not available then an alternative method of extinguishing the fire must be available. This could be a tractor, loader or hand tools to make a fire break to prevent the fire from spreading. Also burning small piles and feeding the small pile from the larger pile is a safe way of conducting a pile burn.

Courtesy must be considered for your neighbours. Please do not smoke them out as it quite often results in a phone call to the brigade to come and extinguish the fire.

The new table is located just north of the breakwall.







Once we have removed weeds from a site we need to return perhaps every six months, perhaps only once a year, to make sure the weeds don't reinvade the site. Recently we have completed a sweep of the foreshore and creek bank on the Callala Beach (Benton Sands) side of Callala Creek. Every time we do this the re-weeding is a smaller job but then we did start removing really dense lantana only six years ago.

The next priority for us will be removing bitou bush from various locations. This is best done during winter while it is growing vigorously. As well as that we need to clear weedy regrowth from the Lackersteen St side of Callala Creek Bushland Reserve and around to the back of Sheaffe St. There is always something to do.

Shoalhaven City Council has recently reprinted copies of its "Grow Me Instead" booklet. In previous articles I've gone on about how some garden plants are inclined to escape and infest our local bush. Senna or "Easter Cassia" is an example. The "Grow Me Instead" booklet provides information on problem plants and suggests local native plant alternatives.
